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Document Title:	PATIENT ADMISSION
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PURPOSE:

- 1. To establish guidelines regarding admission of patients both in the General Unit and Special Area.
- 2. To make patient feel welcome, comfortable and at ease
- 3. To acquire vital information regarding the patient
- 4. To assess the patient from which the nursing care plan can be initiated and implemented
- 5. To give equal consideration to patients of all races, creed, color, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, age, disability, sexual orientation or gender expression.

LEVEL:

Admitting Personnel, Billing Personnel, Medical Doctors, Registered Nurses, Midwife/ Attendants, Dietary Personnel, Laboratory Personnel, DIS Personnel, Pharmacy Personnel, Non-Invasive Cardiovascular Imaging Sciences Personnel, Auxiliary, Central Sterile Supply Room Personnel, Riverside College Clinical Instructor and Students.

DEFINITION OF TERMS:

Admission of patient- allowing and facilitating a patient to stay in the hospital unit or ward for observation, investigation, and treatment of the disease he or she is suffering from.

POLICY:

- Dr. Pablo O. Torre Memorial Hospital (DPOTMH) has an established process for admitting patient in the general unit and special area of the organization.
- 2. No patient shall be denied admission regardless of his/her race, sex, color, religion, ancestry, financial class, national origin, sexual orientation or gender expression.



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- The criterion for admission should be first-come first-served basis, unless it is an emergency case.
- Patient shall receive prompt and timely attention by qualified professional upon entry.
- 5. The organization shall document, follow policies and procedures and provide resources to ensure proper patient triaging.
- The organization shall uniquely identify all patients including newborn and shall create a specific chart for each patient that is readily accessible to authorized personnel.
- 7. The health professional responsible for the care of the patient shall obtain informed consent for treatment.
- Planning for discharge begins upon entry into the organization and ensures coordinated approach to discharge and continuing management.
- 9. Patients need not be tested for RT-PCR upon admission if he/she has Covidrecovered within the last 30 days and can be admitted to regular room. Patient needs to show proof by providing either:
 - 9.1. QR coded copy of RT-PCR result.
 - 9.2. Original Isolation certificate coming from LGU
- 10. Patients who are Covid-recovered 31 days or more prior to admission still needs to be tested for SARS CoV2 RT-PCR.
- 11. All Covid-probable patients waiting for their RT-PCR result as well as Confirmed Covid-positive classified as asymptomatic or mild patient shall be placed in their designated stations.
 - 11.1. Covid probable patients waiting SARS Cov2 RT-PCR result



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- Covid POSITIVE patients who are classified as Asymptomatic or Mild disease.
- 11.3. Station 8 and 10 will be for Covid POSITIVE patients who are classified as Moderate Disease and/or Pneumonia on Chest Xray.
- 12. All Covid-probable patients waiting for their RT-PCR result as well as Confirmed Covid-positive patients who are classified as Severe or Critical Disease; with Severe Pneumonia; on BiPAP, High flow nasal cannula or Mechanical ventilator shall be placed in their designated stations.
- 13. All patient watchers/guardian will be tested with a SARS CoV2 Rapid antigen test or SARS CoV2 RT-PCR.
 - 13.1. If watcher/guardian tests Positive, he/she will not be allowed to remain as watcher for a Covid-Negative patient.
 - 13.2. Only 1 adult watcher/guardian allowed per patient room for the whole duration of the patient's and they should stay within hospital premises.
 - 13.3. If ever there will be a need to change watcher/guardian, he or she will be tested for SARS Cov2 Antigen.
- 14. All patients initially admitted to Regular stations who will test POSITIVE for SARS Cov2 RT-PCR (Incidental) will be transferred to designated station.
- 15. Covid-positive patients admitted at station 8, 10, 14 and 12 who have improved and deemed for de-escalation by the attending physician may be transferred to regular rooms after fulfilling either of these criteria:
 - 15.1. SARS CoV2 RT-PCR Negative Result
 - 15.2. At least 7 days from First day of Symptom
 - 15.3. At least 5 days have passed from last SARS CoV2 RT-PCR positive Result.
- 16. Covid-positive patients admitted at Covid Floors (Station 8, 10, 14, and 12 need not be referred to a Pulmonologist or infectious Disease specialist as long as it is an Asymptomatic (Incidental) or Mild Covid Case.



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- 16.1. Patient should be seen / visited by at least one consultant (Attending or any other co-managed consultant) daily. "Phone or station only visits" will not be allowed.
- 16.2. If patient's condition worsens and becomes a Moderate Covid-referral to a Pulmonologist or infectious Disease specialist is warranted.
