Document Title:	ASSISTING IN UMBILICAL CATHETERIZATION

PURPOSE:

To institute procedures of assisting in umbilical catheterization for patients in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

SCOPE:

Applies to Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Staff of Dr. Pablo O. Torre Memorial Hospital

RESPONSIBLE PERSON:

Physicians, Staff Nurses



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PROCEDURE:

- 1. The Doctor explains the procedure to the family or significant others.
- 2. The Doctor secures the signed consent.
- 3. The Doctor/ Nurse performs hand hygiene.
- 4. The Nurse gathers all the equipment needed for the procedure.
- 5. The Nurse confirms the patient's identity using 2 patient identifiers.
- 6. The Nurse positions the infant correctly and comfortably under radiant warmer, restraining the limbs with clean linens for immobilization.
- 7. The Nurse prepares the umbilical catheterization set/tray and other supplies needed observing proper aseptic technique.
- 8. The Doctor/ Staff Nurse disinfects the umbilical cord and the surrounding area with sterile swab sticks or sterile cotton balls dipped in 10% Povidone Iodine.
- 9. The Doctor drapes the umbilical site with a sterile towel with a hole.
- 10. The Nurse assists the doctor in handling supplies (instruments, suture, 10cc syringe, umbilical catheter, blade, sterile gauze).
- 11. The Doctor ties the area around the Wharton's jelly loosely before cutting the cord to prevent excessive bleeding.
- 12. The Doctor cuts the umbilical cord using sterile iris scissors or surgical blade to about 1-2cm from the skin and locates the umbilical vein using mosquito curve or straight forceps.
- 13. The Doctor grasps the cord stump and holds it upright.
- 14. The Doctor does a purse-string suturing method around the cord using silkam 2-0 HR26.
- 15. The Doctor identifies the umbilical vein for insertion of the umbilical catheter and gently dilates the umbilical vein using closed tip forceps.
- 16. The Doctor inserts umbilical catheter fr. 5 or fr. 3.5 and gradually inserted into the lumen directing it towards the pelvis while gentle traction is exerted on the cord.
- 17. The doctor inserts the umbilical catheter to a depth of 3-5 cm until the free flow of blood is established.
- 18. The Doctor flushes the catheter using isotonic saline solution.

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- 19. The Doctor ties the suture then ties the catheter securely with the ends of the suture.
- 20. The Doctor cleans the surrounding site with normal saline for irrigation and disinfects with 10% Povidone Iodine.
- 21. The Doctor covers the umbilical site with sterile gauze and anchors the dressing with surgical tape.


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


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The Doctor/Staff Nurse disinfects the umbilical cord and the surrounding area with sterile swab sticks or sterile cotton balls dipped in 10% Povidone Iodine.

The Doctor drapes the umbilical site with sterile towel with hole.

The Nurse assists the doctor in handling supplies (instruments, suture, 10cc syringe, umbilical catheter, blade, sterile gauze).

The Doctor ties the area around the Wharton's jelly loosely prior to cutting the cord to prevent excessive bleeding.


The Doctor cuts the umbilical cord using sterile iris scissors or surgical blade to about 1-2cm from the skin, and locates the umbilical vein using mosquito curve or straight forceps.

The Doctor grasps the cord stump and holds it upright.

11. Cuts the umbilical cord using sterile iris scissors or surgical blade to about 1-2cm from the skin, and	Attending Physician

12. Grasps the cord stump and holds it upright.	Attending Physician
13. Does purse-string suturing method around the cord using silkam 2-0 HR26.	Attending Physician
14. Identifies the umbilical vein for insertion of umbilical catheter and gently dilates the umbilical vein using closed tip forceps.	Attending Physician
15. Inserts umbilical catheter fr. 5 or fr. 3.5 and gradually inserted into the lumen directing it towards the pelvis while gentle traction is exerted on the cord.	Attending Physician
16. Inserts the umbilical catheter to a depth of 3-5 cm until free flow of blood is established.	Attending Physician
17. Flushes the catheter using isotonic saline solution.	Attending Physician
18. Cleans the surrounding site with normal saline for irrigation and disinfects with 10% Povidone Iodine.	Attending Physician
19. Covers the umbilical site with sterile gauze and anchors the dressing with micropore.	Attending Physician



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
