Document Title: PHLEBOTOMY / VENIPUNCTURE		

PURPOSE:

To outline the steps required in doing Phlebotomy / Venipuncture.

SCOPE:

Applies to all Respiratory Therapists of Dr. Pablo O. Torre Memorial Hospital

PERSON RESPONSIBLE:

Respiratory Therapist, Nurse, Physician

GENERAL GUIDELINES:

- 1. It is the policy of DPOTMH and the RTS Department to perform venipuncture for Arterial Blood Gas Analysis as ordered by the physician.
- 2. It should be performed by a trained and experienced respiratory therapist, nurse and physician.
- A universal precaution by the Infection Control Department should be observed for proper handling of blood samples, proper disposal of contaminated needles and syringes in appropriate containers.
- 4. The procedure starts after the account has been settled or proper charges have been made for charged transactions.
- 5. Strict adherence to 2 patient identifier for proper identification. Patient's data must be counterchecked first prior to doing the procedure.
 - a) Complete name of patient
 - b) Birthdate
 - c) Age and sex
 - d) Room number
 - e) Request for Blood Gas Analysis
- 6. Possible sites for venipuncture:
 - a) Radial Artery
 - b) Brachial Artery
 - c) Femoral Artery



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d) Dorsalis Artery

7. Phlebotomy sites for venipuncture should only take a maximum of 10 minutes.

PROCEDURE:

- 1 Hands must be washed properly prior to the procedure.
- 2 Assemble all needed materials in a tray: tuberculin syringe, cotton (wet and dry), micropore.
- 3 Identify patient using a 2- Patient identifiers:
 - 3.1 Ask patient's full name, date of birth.
 - 3.2 If patient is unconscious, ask the nurse in charge for identification.
 - 3.3 Check the name of the patient written on the wristband.
- 4 Explain the rationale of the procedure.
- 5 Position the patient.
- 6 Select proper site of venipuncture.
- 7 Clean venipuncture site with 70% isopropyl alcohol.
- 8 Instruct patient while extracting blood.
- 9 Extract required amount of blood.
- 10 Place clean and dry cotton on the punctured site.
- 11 Press the cotton on the puncture site for 5 minutes.
- 12 Cover area with clean, dry cotton and plaster.


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
